

- Nonspecific ST and/or T wave changes



- Slight (< 1 mm) ST depression or elevation *and/or*
- T wave flat or slightly inverted

Normal T waves are usually $\geq 10\%$ the height of R wave.

Can be seen in:

- Heart disease
- Drugs (e.g., amiodarone, sotalol)
- Electrolyte disorders (e.g., hyperkalemia, hypokalemia)
- Hyperventilation
- Myxedema
- Recent large meal
- Stress
- Pancreatitis
- Pericarditis
